Reminders

- Please make sure you remember to send your child's lunch, a drink of water and coat with them to school every day.
- Please do not bring personal belongings into school e.g., trinkets, footballs, etc.
- Arrival time is 8:50a.m. – 9:10a.m. sharp.
- The school gates will be locked at 9:10 a.m. every morning.
- Parking is not permitted in the hall carpark in the mornings. 4th – 6th class pupils will walk down the hall avenue and line up once the gate has been opened.
- At home time, 4th – 6th class parents are permitted to park in the hall carpark. Please remain in your car.
- If you need to collect your child early or for an appointment, please notify the class teacher via email or phone call a day in advance where possible. A member of staff will bring your child to the front pedestrian gate at the

arranged time. You will be requested to sign your child out at the gate. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

- The school will provide your child with approved hand sanitiser. Please do not send in personal hand sanitisers with your child.
- If you would like your child to wear a face mask, it is permitted.
- If your child is absent, please make sure that you email the school explaining why (illness, urgent family reason, etc.). We need to keep this on file for our attendance records. If your child misses more than 20 days, the school is required to report this to Tusla.
- Please remember to send in your child's homework folder on Fridays.
- As requested by Dr. Ronan Glynn in his letter circulated to parents: "Please do not have play dates or organise after school activities which involve household mixing."
